### **Spätzle Recipe**

500g wheat flour  
4-5 eggs  
1 tsp salt  
1/8-1/4 litre water, depending on type of flour  
hot water for tossing the Spätzle  
As a side dish my Spätzle recipe serves 8. For a main course serves 4.  
Mix the flour, eggs and salt in a large bowl. Add the water  
Moisten a Spätzlebrett (a wooden board with a handle on one side and a bevelled edge on the other), with water. Spread a small amount of dough on it and scrape with a broad knife thin strips of dough into slightly boiling water.
